

People use them to store an incredible amount of personal information, from our private conversations to our photos, our music, our notes, our calendars and contacts, our financial information and health data, even where we have been and where we are going.

A Message to Our Customers

The United States government has demanded that Apple take an unprecedented step which threatens the security of our customers. We oppose this order, which has implications far beyond the legal case at hand.

This moment calls for public discussion, and we want our customers and people around the country to understand what is at stake.

The Need for Encryption

Smartphones, led by iPhone, have become an essential part of our lives. People use them to store an incredible amount of personal information, from our private conversations to our photos, our music, our notes, our calendars and contacts, our financial information and health data, even where we have been and where we are going.

All that information needs to be protected from hackers and criminals who want to access it, steal it, and use it without our knowledge or permission. Customers expect Apple and other technology companies to do everything in our power to protect their personal information, and at Apple we are deeply committed to safeguarding their data.

Compromising the security of our personal information can ultimately put our personal safety at risk. That is why encryption has become so important to all of us.

For many years, we have used encryption to protect our customers' personal data because we believe it's the only way to keep their information safe. We have even put that data out of our own reach, because we believe the contents of your iPhone are none of our business.

The San Bernardino Case

We were shocked and outraged by the deadly act of terrorism in San Bernardino last December. We mourn the loss of life and want justice for all those whose lives were affected. The FBI asked us for help in the days following the attack, and we have worked hard to support the government's efforts to solve this horrible crime. We have no sympathy for terrorists.

When the FBI has requested data that's in our possession, we have provided it. Apple complies with valid subpoenas and search warrants, as we have in the San Bernardino case. We have also made Apple engineers available to advise the FBI, and we've offered our best ideas on a number of investigative options at their disposal.

We have great respect for the professionals at the FBI, and we believe their intentions are good. Up to this point, we have done everything that is both within our power and within the law to help them. But now the U.S. government has asked us for something we simply do not have, and something we consider too dangerous to create. They have asked us to build a backdoor to the iPhone.

Many users will see references to an application called MacKeeper on various web sites and via pop-ups on their browser. Not only is it expensive for what it purports to do (freeware applications that do the same or more are readily available), it can sometimes install itself without the user realising it, and it can be very tricky to get rid of. The only utility you must run on a system is a [backup utility](#), and only backed up systems should be troubleshooted with system management utilities, as you may have a hardware problem causing the other system issues, and the only way to isolate hardware or software issues is on a backed up system, otherwise you may completely make your data inaccessible by accident.

MacKeeper has been described by various sources as highly invasive malware* that can de-stabilize your operating system, adding that it is unethically marketed, with a history of making false advertising claims, by a company called Zeobit, and a rip-off.

What is MacKeeper?

MacKeeper is a 3rd party application for Mac. But it provides annoying tabs and popup ads. Most people said "This is a malware". Sometimes this software automatically installed via Cnet downloader.

Lot of Mac users reported in ASC about "How to get rid of MacKeeper?". Lot of users thing it's not easy to uninstall MacKeeper app from Mac. Because they can't find quit command in MacKeeper menu bar.

How to remove MacKeeper?

If you want to remove MacKeeper from your computer, follow my steps.

1. First launch MacKeeper app from Applications folder. Then quit it using MacKeeper application menu (You don't need to activate or sign in it's services).
2. After it done, drag the Mackeeper to trash. It will popup a prompt for Mac administrator's passcode. Enter the password to move the app to trash.

OS X El Capitan: Use your Mac to make and receive phone calls

When you want to make or receive a phone call, you don't have to reach for your iPhone—you can use your Mac. When someone calls you, a notification appears on your Mac and you can take the call.

You can start a phone call on your Mac from FaceTime, Contacts, Safari, Mail, Maps, Spotlight, and many other apps.

Note: Phone calls you make and receive on your Mac use cellular minutes—cellular charges may apply.

Requirements

To make and receive phone calls on your Mac, make sure of the following:

- Your iPhone has iOS 8 or later installed.
- Your Mac and iPhone are on the same Wi-Fi network. For more information, see [Connect to the Internet using Wi-Fi](#).
- Your Mac and iPhone are signed in to iCloud and FaceTime using the same Apple ID. For more information, see [Set up iCloud on your Mac](#) and [Sign in to FaceTime](#).
- Your Mac and iPhone have Wi-Fi calls turned on.

Set up your iPhone

iOS 9: Go to Settings > Phone. Different options appear depending on your carrier.

- If you see Wi-Fi calling, tap it, then turn Wi-Fi Calling on This iPhone on.

After you turn on Wi-Fi calling, you may see an Add Wi-Fi Calling For Other Devices button. Tap it to allow calls using your other devices that aren't on the same Wi-Fi network as your iPhone, or if your phone is off. Otherwise, you can still use your Mac to make phone calls, but your iPhone must be turned on and on the same Wi-Fi network as your Mac.

Note: Only certain phone carriers support Wi-Fi calls for devices that are not on the same Wi-Fi network as your iPhone. For information, see the Apple Support article [Make a call over Wi-Fi](#). You also need iPhone 5s, iPhone 5c, or later.

- If you see Calls on Other Devices, tap it, then turn it on.

This option allows calls using your other devices that are on the same Wi-Fi network as your iPhone.

iOS 8: Go to Settings > FaceTime, then turn iPhone Cellular Calls on.

You will need a iPhone on the same network and it needs to be close by.

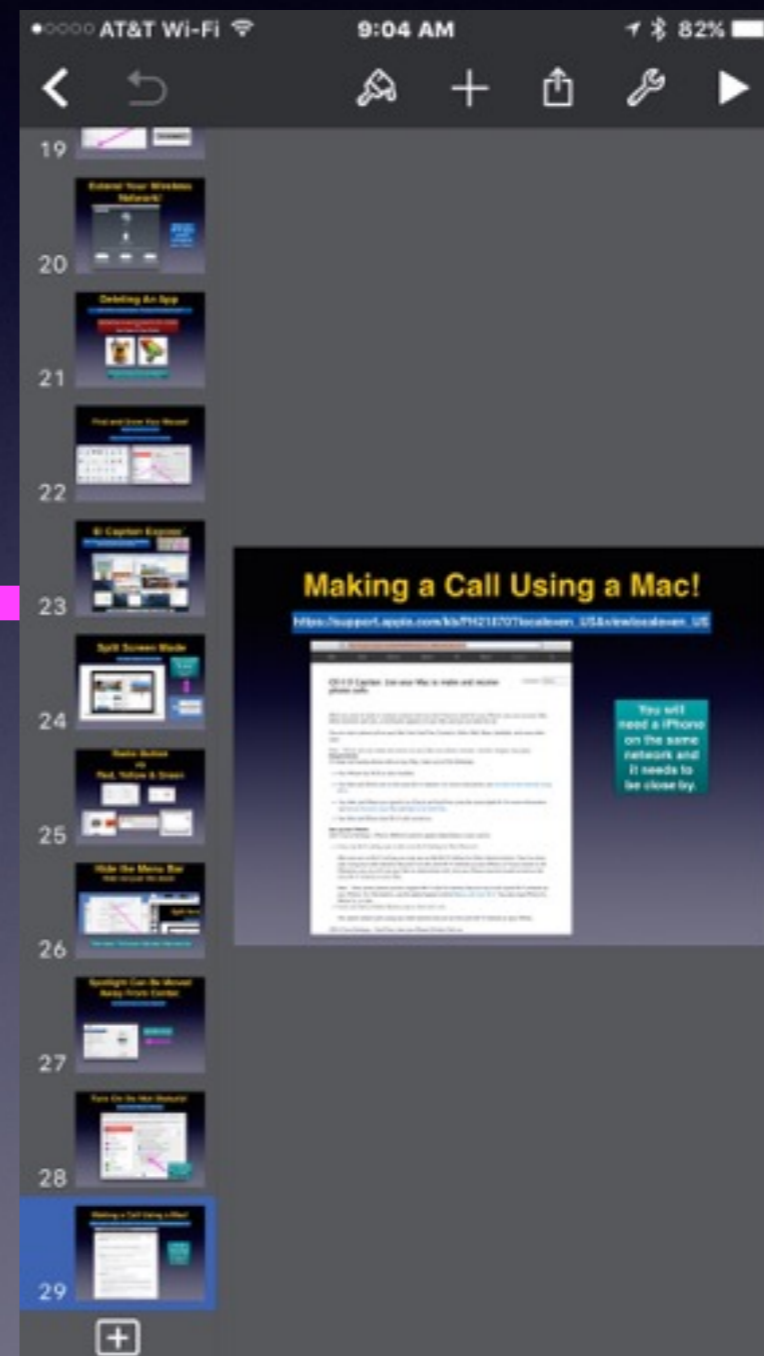
